- ✓ Grade 12 students must be enrolled in a minimum of 30 credits at OHS to participate in the OHS Graduation Ceremony.

Science 24 or any 20 level Science (Biology/Physics/Chemistry/Science)

English 30-1 or 30-2

Social Studies 30-1 or 30-2

10 credits in Fine Arts/CTS/Physical Education 20 or 30/2nd Language

10 other credits at the 30 level

- ✓ OHS students have an opportunity to enroll in dual credit courses in the areas of welding, machining, carpentry, hairstyling, cosmetology, landscape design, equine, fashion, office administration, business, tourism and health care offered through Olds College.
